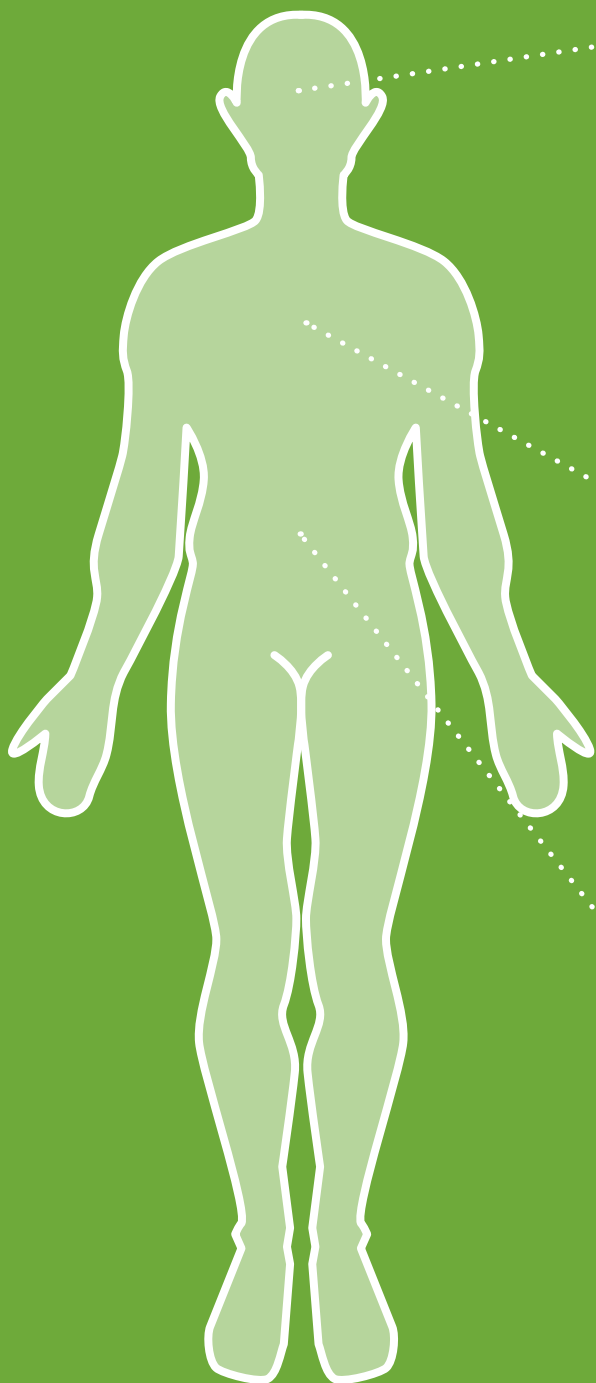

## Symptoms by Type of Pain

### Somatic

Somatic pain refers to pain that results from actual tissue injury. Pain sensations are transmitted to the spinal cord and brain through the peripheral nervous system.

### Nerve

“Neuropathic” pain results from partial or complete nerve injury. A different part of the nervous system often becomes involved, the sympathetic nervous system, and requires special treatment. This type of pain can be associated with other nervous system symptoms and can be particularly difficult to treat.

### Cancer

Cancer related pain can result from the actual disease/tumor or from the treatments (Chemotherapy/radiation) used against the disease. Medical science has made great advances in the treatment of this type of pain utilizing ultrasophisticated technology.
